Community Leadership Awards

Background:

2007 was the inaugural year to identify adult community leaders for nomination to be awarded the United Way of Greater Simcoe County (UWGSC) Community Leadership Award. In 2008 the awards were expanded to include Youth and Student leader categories. The Student category was awarded to Audrey O'Brien, who improved the quality of life for many through her volunteer work at Couchiching Jubilee House in Orillia. The Youth category was won by Allison Bobbette, through her involvement with Simcoe Community Services Youth Program and numerous local and provincial projects as an advisor and advocate. The Adult category was awarded to Kevin Lehman, who provided managerial and technical expertise and made outstanding contributions to various community based projects in Ramara. These awards will be presented annually at UWGSC's Annual General Meeting at the end of June.

Nomination and Award Selection Process:

Individuals and organizations are invited to submit a nomination for adult, youth or student community leaders in accordance with the provisions set out in the award nomination form. This nomination must be supported by two letters of reference and be received at UWGSC offices no later than May 15th of each year.

UWGSC's Board of Directors will convene an Ad Hoc awards committee to screen and review award nominations. Award recipients will be informed of this decision in early June so that preparation can be made to attend the AGM. Award nominations not selected will be informed in writing to the person or group submitting the award nomination.

Community Leadership Award Criteria

Adult – 30 years +

Youth – 19 to 29 years

Student – 18 and under

In addition to their regular involvement in volunteer activities, community leader volunteers go the extra mile to get involved in programs and activities that benefit the communities in which they live and work. These individuals have demonstrated a significant community accomplishment and displayed leadership qualities, initiative, creativity, and dedication. Through their involvement, they inspire others to get involved and make a difference in the lives of others.

- Leadership – Ability to motivate and inspire others to accomplish a specific goal or objective.
- Initiative – Demonstrates ability to take charge by creating or developing a program, project, or activity that impacts the community. Has a personal commitment to see the project through to its resolution with determined effort.
- Creativity – Develops/proposes creative ways to accomplish the goals and objectives of the project.
- Dedication – Is recognized by others for being dedicated to achieving the desired results. Accomplishes much within the community by his or her pursuit, courage, enthusiasm, and zeal.
- Recognition - Recognized by others for their commitment to the success of the initiative.
